Special Message for all Bingo Division Licensees

- 1) The bill author of HB 914, Representative Senfronia Thompson, provided the agency with a letter of legislative intent which clarifies the process for the agency's automated method of calculation of Charitable Distribution amounts which are disseminated to each organization after each quarter. Thanks to the industry representatives who worked with the Bingo Division staff on this matter.
- 2) Bingo Division Audit Services Department will resume audit operations for active audit projects one week after the involved organization is open and conducting Bingo.
- 3) Delinquent Purchaser List: The Bingo Enabling Act requires all license holders to notify the Commission if another licensee has failed to pay for bingo products within 30 days of actual delivery. Upon notification, the Commission is required to notify all manufacturers and distributors of the default, which is done via a delinquent purchaser list available on our website. For more information, please review the following:
 - a. 2001.218 of the Bingo Enabling Act, which requires notification by licensees and the Commission; and
 - b. Bingo Rule 402.604, which defines the reporting and posting requirements for delivered or leased equipment.
