amendments to 16 TAC §403.301 (Historically Underutilized Businesses)

<u>Recommendation</u>: Staff recommends the Commission initiate the rulemaking process by publishing the attached proposal in the *Texas Register* to receive public comment for a period of 30 days.

The Texas Lottery Commission (Commission) proposes amendments to 16 TAC §403.301

2 (Historically Underutilized Businesses). The purpose of the amendments is to correct citations to

Office of the Comptroller rules that have been moved.

Kathy Pyka, Controller, has determined that for each year of the first five years the proposed amendments will be in effect, there will be no significant fiscal impact for state or local governments as a result of the proposed amendments. There will be no adverse effect on small businesses or rural communities, micro businesses, or local or state employment. There will be no additional economic cost to persons required to comply with the amendments as proposed.
