We 3 do have some Sunset members here today. If there's anything 5 y'all would like to comment. If not, we'll move on. 6 Okay. 7 All right. Excellent. LaDonna, does staff 8 have anything on that? 9 MS. CASTAÑUELA: We're trudging along on a 10 number of requests and we've had a number of meetings 11 including, we did visit a bingo hall here in Austin in 12 October. And that's it. CHAIRMAN SMITH: 13 Excellent. Any other comment? Excellent. 14 AGENDA ITEM 6 1.5 CHAIRMAN SMITH: Moving on to item number 6, 16 rules review update. Every so often we have to go through 17 the rule review process and we go through all the rules in 18 the Bingo Enabling Act. I think most of the BAC members 19 should have gotten a full binder of rules to start reviewing, 2.0 but we haven't actually formally started that process for us 21 to go through the rules. We're ready to do that whenever 22 staff's ready to include us on that. 2.3 MR. VANCE: This is Tyler Vance, Assistant 24 General Counsel. We don't have a defined schedule on it 25 right now, but -- so it was published in October, so it would

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need to be closed by April. And what we did last time was we passed around a copy of all the rules. I think you guys formed a committee on this, a subcommittee. And then we met separately. It wasn't a BAC meeting. I think it was open to the public, but it was really just the committee members and myself and the industry attorneys. And we just hashed it out. We went line by line through every rule. I provided staff's comments. There were certain things that we wanted changed, and then you guys provided your input. I revised it, sent it back. There's a little bit of back and forth, but it mainly -- most of it took place in a single meeting that we had, it was a long one, in the old building upstairs with the rules committee members. So I would recommend that you guys do that again.

I think that worked really well where you appoint some kind of rules committee and it -- last time it did involve the Steves and Kim Kiplin and so it doesn't have to be just BAC members. You can appoint anybody you want. And then we'll work with that committee. And then at the end of that process, the rules review was adopted without changes in April, and then at the next meeting in June, we came with all the proposed changes.

And I think that worked well last time. So I suspect we'll do a similar process this time, so we'll let -- you know, we'll go back and forth with you guys with this

CHAIRMAN SMITH: Moving on to item number 7, Emile Bourgoyne. Emile, before I give you the floor for a moment to speak I just want to say what a valuable asset you have been to the Bingo Advisory Committee over the years. Your knowledge and your expertise have overwhelmed us at times and we've had to play catch up over the years. But we appreciate you and we are definitely going to miss you. Even though you'll still be technically on the committee until the end of December, this is our last meeting for this year, but we love you and we wish you the best of luck in your future endeavors. And the floor is yours, sir.

MR. BOURGOYNE: Well, I'm very sorry I couldn't be here today in person, but, things just didn't work out on my end. It's been an honor and a privilege to serve on this committee, and I've had the blessings of both my bosses, Phil Glassman at Gamco and later the Pollards, to allow me to be on this committee and represent all manufacturers, not just the one that I work for. And that's, I would hope that my predecessor, whoever follows me, has the same latitude to do that. And it's been fun.

CHAIRMAN SMITH: Well, thank you, Emile.

- 19 have had four applications. I sent you all the first one I
- 20 thought was legitimate. The other two, they were not
- 21 | manufacturers, they were just operators. And we are looking
- 22 | for a manufacturer to fill the manufacturer position. So we
- 23 | did wind up getting two applications for the -- two approved
- 24 applications for the manufacturer position. The first one
- 25 | was Larry Segebarth. I don't know if y'all remember looking

- 1 | at his application. And the second one was Floyd Olive.
- 2 Which many of y'all know both of those gentlemen. I do not
- 3 | have Larry's, it's not pulling up. I can't bring up Larry's
- 4 application right now. But at this time I'd like to invite
- 5 | those two applicants to come up and give a brief talk about
- 6 theirself or kind of tell us what what they envision
- 7 | theirselves doing. Although we have their applications
- 8 already.
- 9 MR. DUNCAN: I believe there's only one.
- 10 CHAIRMAN SMITH: We'll just -- yeah, okay. So
- 11 | Larry's not here today. Floyd, if you wouldn't mind coming
- 12 up and giving us a brief description of what you do, how you
- 13 | do it, and how long you've been in the industry. Right
- 14 there, sir.
- MR. OLIVE: Yes, my name's Floyd Olive. I
- 16 | started working in a bingo hall back in '86 selling paper,
- 17 | selling pull-tabs. Worked my way up to working in the cage
- 18 and ultimately the pull-tab manager at (indiscernible) --
- 19 this is going to sound bad, but Choctaw bingo. I know this
- 20 | is a sore spot with a lot of Texas charitable organizations,
- 21 because they do take a lot of business from Texas.
- 22 From there I started working with
- 23 (indiscernible) King, which turned into Video King, which is
- 24 | now F3. So all totaled in the bingo industry I've been
- 25 | around for about 37 years. I've worked all throughout the

- 1 United States and outside in military organizations with
- 2 | bingo. I've seen a lot of different programs. I've seen a
- 3 lot of stuff that worked, a lot of things that didn't. I'd
- 4 like the opportunity to bring some of that knowledge to the
- 5 charitable organizations.
- I know that Everi is fully committed to the
- 7 | charitable organizations in Texas, and not just Everi, but
- 8 | all manufacturers I feel are deeply involved with the
- 9 organizations and would really relish the opportunity to
- 10 help.
- 11 CHAIRMAN SMITH: Thank you very much. And
- 12 | what products does Everi do? Is it mostly just video or is
- 13 | it paper, tabs, everything or?
- MR. OLIVE: Electronics.
- 15 CHAIRMAN SMITH: Electronics.
- 16 MR. OLIVE: Electronics. Yeah, we do not have
- 17 | currently any of the paper or pull-tabs.
- 18 CHAIRMAN SMITH: Okay. Tommy, like to add
- 19 anything?
- MR. DUNCAN: He knows everybody. He knows all
- 21 | the manufacturers. He's easy to work with.
- 22 CHAIRMAN SMITH: Okay. Excellent. Any other
- 23 | comment? Okay. We've got two applications. One's Larry
- 24 | Segabarth. Larry's not here today. And we've got Floyd's.
- 25 | So we kind of, normally we have more applications than this

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for an open seat. Someone earlier suggested do we reopen

                    As Trace mentioned, we had three bingo
19
    community meetings over the last couple of months. They were
20
    designed to do a couple of things. One, to help educate the
21
    various members. They were hosted by Texas Charity
22
    Advocates, the Bingo Interest Group, and Texans for
23
    Charitable Bingo. Had one in Dallas, roughly 40 folks there;
24
    one in San Antonio, roughly 40 folks there; and then we had
25
     50 plus in the Houston area.
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So we wanted to educate folks on the Sunset process. It's been a while since we've been through this process, so it was a good reminder for those who had been through it before, but also an opportunity to educate folks who hadn't been through this process before. And we also wanted to give them a heads up on the rules review so that they can be thinking about that -- that process as well when we get into it in the early part of the year.

We also wanted to elicit feedback from the community as we go through the Sunset process or things that we might communicate to the Sunset staff. And broadly speaking, there were about five big buckets that came out of those meetings: administrative oversight; illegal gaming; promotion of the game; improving the customer experience; and then lastly, casino gaming, most broadly speaking were the five issues that came up out of those meetings. And then we tried to get into some in-depth discussion and some specificity as to what the community might want to see done, if possible, through the Sunset process or through standalone legislation going into the next legislative session.

The types of things that -- that kind of came up a little bit more specific under those different buckets; penalty issue -- under the administrative oversight -- penalty issues, the understanding of the game by staff and potential training opportunities there, IT issues, and the

usability of the various portals.

Under illegal gaming, we tried to come up with a fairly comprehensive list of the types of illegal gaming that we see, whether it's Facebook, illegal eight liners, purse bingo, those types of things. And then possible ways that that might be addresse.

Promotion of the game. We all know attendance continues to be probably the biggest heartburn issue that the community faces. I don't know where we'll end up this year, but it's very likely that for the first time we'll have under 10 million in attendance. And that's down from I think, the peak that that I would call the peak being somewhere around 18 million, 17 to 18 million in 2007-2008 time period. So how — what can we do to enhance and promote the game, improving the customer experience. It kind of falls back to the what are the tools in the toolkit.

We've got some good tools this last legislative session in terms of eliminating the game cap and increasing the session cap. What can we add to the toolkit that conductors and operators have to attract more customers to the game?

And then lastly, although it probably doesn't fall under the purview of Sunset, there was broad discussion about casino gaming and the possibility, and of course, with the sale of the Mavericks to the Sands folks, there's been a

lot of discussion around that, and you've seen lots of stories, particularly in the DFW area. But there was discussion about what sort of posture that the charitable bingo would be going forward in those issues.

- So it's a broad overview, it was a good discussion, it's an opportunity for us to get feedback from the community as we prepare to sit down with Sunset staff and talk about the agency and its role in regulating the game.
- So I'm happy to answer any questions or
  address any issues that I might have missed or that you want.
  Yes, ma'am.
  - MS. GREEN: And just to, you know, I am from DFW, so, the Mark Cuban sale; he had said, I mean, quote, I'll never sell the Mavericks except to the Sands Resorts in Las Vegas in order to get -- remove the Mavericks for a new arena, new casino, and a new resort. And now they've bought the land where Texas Stadium used to be. Very big, very big piece of land.
  - So, this is very serious. I -- and she's got \$35-billion left. She could buy everybody in the legislature -- not buy them. She could donate generously. And I could see them saying, well, let the people decide.
  - So as of right now, we probably have seven years left to go as we know it in those large areas. And it's going to be very important what the rules committee and

the Sunset do, because, you know, as you know, bingo's never 1 been run as a business. We're told how much we have to have, how much we have to give away, who we have to buy from and 3 now it's basically a monopoly. You know, we're told how to 5 run our business exactly. So, I think we have seven years to try to keep 6 7 going and make this work. Because if not, that 10 -- that --8 the 10 million you're talking about, that's going to be in 9 just the small cities. 10 MR. STEWART: Look like the good old days. 11 MS. GREEN: Well, Dallas, Houston and San Antonio 12 will all be dead to the casinos. So anyway, it's very real. 13 MR. STEWART: Yes. 14 MS. GREEN: It's very real, so --1.5 MR. STEWART: Absolutely. 16 CHAIRMAN SMITH: And I'm sure we'll get into 17 more specifics of that, but you're absolutely right. I think 18 the (indiscernible) was 75 miles, if I'm not mistaken, right, 19 Tom? MR. STEWART: The what? 20 CHAIRMAN SMITH: If a bingo hall's within 75 21 miles of a casino, they just forget them. MR. STEWART: Yeah, one -- one of the things 22 23 that we heard in these meetings that, you know, the -- where

it was something like lose up to, you know, half within that

casino gaming comes -- well, I can't even remember now, but

75 mile radius, you lose about half of your business and 1 participation in the game. It bounces back a little bit in 2 3 the second and the third year, but you don't get it all back. MS. GREEN: No. We're losing a huge number of 4 5 our people now just to Choctaw and WinStar. MR. STEWART: Right. 6 7 MS. GREEN: Which are an hour from us. The traffic is bad in Dallas, it takes you an hour just to drive 8 9 to the bingo hall, or you can go straight up to WinStar and 10 Choctaw. So, we're losing, it -- it -- this is really hard, this is really rough. So we're just trying to hold on. 11 12 CHAIRMAN SMITH: Tom, thank you. Any other 13 questions for Tom? 14 MR. 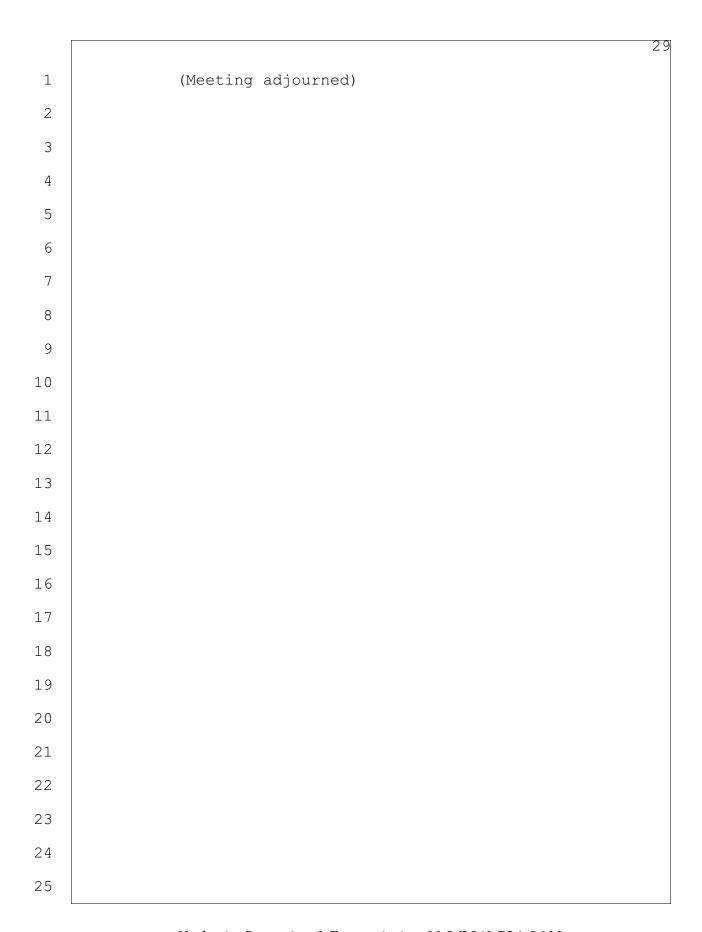
