BINGO ADVISORY COMMITTEE 2023-2024 ANNUAL REPORT

16 TAC 402.102(n) and the 2023-2024 work plan requires an annual report by the Bingo Advisory Committee to the Commission. This report provides the Commission with information required by both the statute and rule and additional information so that it is comprehensive.

This report uses data provided by the Charitable Bingo Division. The data may not have been audited. The statute uses the term "net proceeds" while the rule uses the term "net receipts." For purposes of this report, the terms are synonymous.

GROSS RECEIPTS

Gross receipts increased slightly in calendar year 2023 to \$901.6 million. That is just under a one percent increase over the Calendar year 2022, which had \$896.6 million in gross receipts. Gross receipts in 2021 were \$938.4 million.

Pull tab sales continued to drive overall sales. However, predatory pricing in urban markets continues to have negative consequences for regular bingo sales and net receipts. Supply chain issues have largely disappeared. However, consolidation and belt-tightening among suppliers diminish the diversity of pull-tab products available to conductors.

ADJUSTED GROSS RECEIPTS (AGR)

The term "adjusted gross receipts" is defined as the amount remaining after prizes and fees to state and local government are paid.

AGR in 2023 was \$202.6 million compared to almost \$198 million in the 2022 calendar year. That is a 2.3 percent increase year-over-year. AGR in 2021 was \$214.2 million.

NET PROCEEDS (NET RECEIPTS)

Overall net proceeds to charities - the total amount of money retained by charity conductors of bingo after payment of all expenses - saw a slight increase in 2023. At almost \$30.7 million that's more than four percent higher than 2022 net proceeds of \$28.8 million.

Net proceeds were almost 15.2% of Adjusted Gross Receipts in 2023, compared to 14.5% in 2022.

REPORTED CHARITABLE DISTRIBUTIONS

The Bingo Enabling Act requires charity conductors to distribute, for charitable purposes, all net proceeds that exceed the maximum capital reserve allowed by the Act. Some organizations choose to maintain capital reserves lower than allowed and distribute net proceeds beyond what may be statutorily required. Maintaining a capital reserve is fundamental to a business. This explains the difference in net proceeds for charitable distributions to the charities.

Charitable distributions for 2023 were \$28.3 million, compared to \$29.7 million in 2022.

<u>EXPENSES</u>

For the purposes of this report, expenses here are calculated by subtracting net proceeds from AGR.

In 2023, aggregate expenses increased modestly in 2022 to \$171.9 million compared to \$169.2 million in 2022. That is a 1.6 percent increase year-over-year.

<u>ATTENDANCE</u>

At 10.08 million, attendance continued its slide down, but only slightly. Attendance in calendar year 2022 was 10.1 million. This ongoing decline remains worrisome. Since 2007, attendance has plummeted 44 percent when it peaked at 17.9 million.

This continues to be the largest threat to charitable bingo and the approximately 1,000 non-profits that generate revenue for their community work.

We hope that legislative changes (new prize structure, more temporary sessions) will yield results in 2024 to further slow the decline in attendance.

As noted in the past, market research indicates that a general lack of awareness poses a significant challenge for charitable bingo. Bingo is not the top choice compared to other entertainment options. Private-sector digital advertising conducted pre-COVID and post-COVID has shown promising returns on investment. Nevertheless, charitable bingo should consider a public-private partnership to generate the resources required for scaling promotional efforts in a large state like Texas.

PROVIDING FEEDBACK

The BAC has successfully provided feedback and comments to the CBOD staff and Commissioners on all administrative rules and amendments. It actively engages in the current rules review and the Texas Sunset Advisory Commission's review of the TLC and CBOD.

WEBSITE REVIEW

The BAC is still currently reviewing and collecting data to report its recommendations to the Staff and Commissioners.

REPORTING

The BAC successfully reported to the Commission updates on the BACs activities, industry accomplishments, challenges, and concerns.

ANNUAL REPORT

The BAC has submitted the required annual report to the Commission and to the CBOD Director.

CONCLUDING COMMENT:

By the numbers, Charitable Bingo had a solid year in 2023. Net proceeds had a bounce back. Attendance showed only a modest decrease. And aggregate expenses were essentially flat for 2023.

Our view is that the tools provided by the Texas Legislature had a positive impact, but we will better assess that impact in 2025 after more than a full year of implementation.

Regardless, there is little doubt that without new tools and some form of awareness

campaign, the future of charitable bingo as a source of revenue for roughly 1,000 non-profits across the state is threatened.

The Bingo Advisory Committee remains committed to working with the Commissioners and CBOD staff to advise and respond to the issues that arise this year and those to come. We particularly want to thank the Lottery and Bingo Division staff for the collaborative working relationship. While we do not, nor expect, to always agree, searching for common ground and consensus - which they regularly do - is very much appreciated.

We also appreciate the time and attention that Commissioner Fields provides as the designated Charitable Bingo Commissioner and the responsiveness of the Chairman and all Commissioners when called upon. Thank you.

FY 2025 Annual Work Plan

- 1. Identify potential rule or procedural changes that may help organizations address challenges related to conducting charitable bingo. Any potential recommendations on changes to how bingo games are played shall be clearly authorized by Texas law but may also include research, consideration, and discussion of issues not authorized by Texas law.
- 2. Continue to make recommendations and assist in the 2024 charitable bingo rules review and make a final recommendation to the Texas Lottery Commission regarding adoption.
- 3. Review ways that other states and jurisdictions assist charities, including by promoting awareness among consumers.
- 4. Monitor legislative activity that may impact charitable bingo especially issues related to recommendations and proposals by the Sunset Advisory Commission and staff.
- 5. Provide support as needed to secure legislative approval of any proposed CBOD requested changes to the Bingo Enabling Act.
- 6. Provide feedback and comments to CBOD staff and Commissioners on changes to administrative rules in chapter 402 and any other new additional amendments.
- 7. Work with CBOD staff to identify ways to increase filing of quarterly reports using the online filing system.
- 8. Review components of the agency's charitable bingo website, including the listing of BAC members, and recommend elements and information to be included in future website updates.
- 9. Provide reports at each Commission meeting that include status updates of the BAC's activities, industry accomplishments, challenges or concerns.
- 10. Develop the required BAC annual report to the Commission on the state of the charitable bingo industry and submit to the Commission and to the Charitable Bingo Director by July 15, 2025.
