# LARGEST TEXAS TWO STEP ${ }^{\circledR}$ JACKPOT IN 17 YEARS UP FOR GRABS TONIGHT 

The jackpot stands at an estimated $\mathbf{\$ 2 . 2 5}$ million $\boldsymbol{-}$ the $\mathbf{2}^{\text {nd }}$ largest in game history


#### Abstract

AUSTIN - The game that makes the most jackpot winners in Texas each year just got more exciting. After nine draws without a winner, the Texas Two Step ${ }^{\circledR}$ jackpot that started as a $\$ 200,000$ prize for the drawing on Sept. 7 has grown to an estimated $\$ 2.25$ million prize for the Thursday, Oct. 12 drawing - the largest since 2006. This is the second largest Texas Two Step jackpot on record and only the sixth time the game has reached the $\$ 2$ million threshold since the game started in 2001. "It's been more than 17 years since we have had a Texas Two Step jackpot this large," said Gary Grief, executive director of the Texas Lottery Commission. "If a player matches all four numbers plus the bonus ball, they'll be the biggest Texas Two Step winner since 2006. We want to remind our players to play responsibly. It only takes one ticket to win."


The largest Texas Two Step jackpot in game history was a $\$ 2.9$ million prize for the April 27, 2006 drawing, which was shared by three individuals: Marechia A. Faggett, of Longview; Sukhjeet S. Sekhon, of Longview; and Roberto C. Fernandez, of San Antonio. Two winning tickets were sold at Cowboys in Longview and the third was purchased at Ben's Ice and Food Store in San Antonio.

The last time Texas Two Step had a jackpot of more than $\$ 2$ million was for the March 15, 2021 drawing when it reached $\$ 2.15$ million. So far in 2023, there have been 30 Texas Two Step jackpot winners, including an advertised $\$ 1.55$ million jackpot prize that was shared by 10 winners in the April 6 drawing.

Texas Two Step jackpots start at $\$ 200,000$, and the jackpot amount increases for the next drawing until there is a winner. Players win the jackpot by matching all four of the white ball numbers (1-35) and one Bonus Ball number (1-35) to the numbers drawn. The game features overall odds of one in 32.4. Texas Two Step drawings are conducted on Mondays and Thursdays at 10:12 p.m. CT and tickets must be purchased by 10:02 p.m. CT.
