LOTTO TEXAS® JACKPOT ENTERS \$80 MILLION RANGE; 5TH LARGEST IN GAME HISTORY

Top prize for Wednesday's drawing is set at an estimated \$80.75 million

AUSTIN – Lotto Texas® continues its run at history, as the jackpot has broken into the \$80 million range for [Wednesday night's \(Feb. 12\) drawing](#), with the top prize now worth an **estimated annuitized \$80.75 million** – the fifth biggest jackpot in the history of the game and the [third largest currently up for grabs in the world](#). Wednesday's drawing offers a cash value worth an estimated \$44.4 million. If there is no jackpot winner on Wednesday, the jackpot prize for the Saturday, Feb. 15 drawing will roll to an estimated annuitized \$83.25 million.

"While the Texas weather may be blowing hot and cold, the excitement of this Lotto Texas run is only heating up," said Ryan Mindell, executive director of the Texas Lottery. "With the top prize now exceeding \$80 million, the buzz continues to build as players eagerly anticipate Wednesday's drawing. As players daydream about winning such a large prize, we want to remind everyone that Texas Lottery games are for players 18 and older, and it only takes one ticket to win."

Wednesday's drawing will be the 100th in the current Lotto Texas jackpot run since starting as an estimated annuitized \$5 million for the June 26, 2024 drawing, continuing a new record for the longest jackpot run in game history. This is the largest Lotto Texas jackpot since the April 22, 2023 drawing, when the advertised jackpot reached an estimated \$95 million. The largest Lotto Texas jackpot in game history was an advertised \$145 million prize for the June 19, 2004 drawing which was sold in El Paso and claimed by VOM Enterprises, Ltd.

Lotto Texas has had one other jackpot won in the \$80 million range throughout the game's 32-year history. The March 7, 2001 drawing boasted an advertised \$85 million prize, which was claimed by RBH CNC, LTD. The winning ticket was purchased at Shoppers Mart #24, in Austin.

In 2024, there were two Lotto Texas jackpot winners. The game's most recent jackpot winner was an [Austin resident who claimed a jackpot prize of \\$29 million](#) for the drawing held on June 24, 2024.

While the jackpot prize in the current run remains up for grabs, many Texas Lottery players have been coming away with lower-tier Lotto Texas prizes. For players that choose the game's popular add-on feature – Extra! – for \$1 more per Play, non-jackpot prizes could be increased by up to \$10,000. In the [Feb. 10 drawing](#), 69,619 Lotto Texas tickets, including those that played Extra!, won lower-tier prizes ranging from \$2 to \$12,684.

Lotto Texas is played by picking six numbers from one to 54 and offers multimillion-dollar jackpots. Drawings are held every Monday, Wednesday and Saturday at 10:12 p.m. CT. For \$1 more per Play, a player can select the Extra! add-on feature for a chance to win up to \$10,000 more on non-jackpot prizes. Ticket sales for the next Lotto Texas drawing will close at 10:02 p.m. CT on Wednesday. More information about playing Lotto Texas and the Extra! add-on feature can be found [here](#).
