\$1.8 BILLION POWERBALL® JACKPOT-WINNING TICKET SOLD IN FREDERICKSBURG

Texas Lottery[®] player to share the jackpot prize with Missouri player,

Largest jackpot prize in Texas Lottery history,

Three other Texas players won second-tier prizes up to \$2 million

AUSTIN – A jackpot-winning ticket for the estimated annuitized \$1.8 billion Powerball® Grand Prize that was advertised for the Sept. 6 drawing was purchased in Fredericksburg. The winning ticket, with player-chosen numbers, was sold at Big's 103, located at 11905 E. U.S. Highway 290, and matched all six numbers drawn (11-23-44-61-62, Powerball 17). With a second jackpot-winning ticket sold in Missouri, the two winners will share the Grand Prize. The \$1.8 billion jackpot is the largest prize involving a Texas Lottery player and is the second largest in both Powerball and U.S. lottery history. Texas' player chose the cash value option at the time of purchase and, according to the Multi-State Lottery Association, will receive approximately \$410.3 million before taxes. The Texas Lottery's winner has not yet come forward to claim the prize. The ticket holder has 180 days from the draw date to claim the prize. Big's 103 is eligible to receive a \$250,000 retailer bonus for selling the jackpot-winning ticket.

"We are thrilled that a Texas Lottery player holds one of the winning tickets for this remarkable Powerball jackpot," said Courtney Arbour, executive director of the Texas Department of Licensing and Regulation (TDLR), which now oversees the Texas Lottery. "We look forward to congratulating the winner when they come forward to claim their prize and celebrating with the selling retailer, who is eligible to receive a bonus. This historic jackpot run generated significant sales in Texas, which will greatly benefit public education in our state. Texans can take pride in knowing exciting jackpot wins like this are supported by secure, well-run games, and that commitment continues as the Texas Lottery begins its new chapter under TDLR. If you believe you are the lucky ticket holder, we recommend that you sign your ticket, keep it in a safe place, seek financial and legal advice, and then call the Texas Lottery to schedule an appointment to claim the prize."

In addition to the Sept. 6 jackpot-winning prize, three second-tier Powerball winning tickets were sold in the Lone Star State. A winning ticket worth \$2 million was sold in Tyler, and two tickets worth \$1 million each were purchased in Austin and Midlothian. Since the start of 2025, 17 Texas Lottery players have now won second-tier Powerball prizes of \$1 million or larger, including 10 during the latest jackpot run.

Overall, 763,860 winning Powerball tickets – with prizes ranging from \$4 to the jackpot prize – were purchased in the state for Saturday's drawing. Total Texas sales for the drawing exceeded \$43.8 million.

This is the Texas Lottery's third Powerball jackpot winner since joining the multijurisdictional game in 2010 and the first since February 2015, when claimant from Austin won a share of the \$564.1 million jackpot prize with two other winners. Texas had its first Powerball jackpot winner in 2013 when a resident of Bells claimed the \$40 million jackpot from the May 29, 2013 drawing. With the latest jackpot win, the Texas Lottery has now had at least one Powerball or Mega Millions jackpot winner in each of the last three years.

The winning Powerball jackpot started as a \$20 million prize on June 2 and continued for 42 drawings, setting a record for the game's longest jackpot run before being hit on Saturday. The jackpot for the next Powerball drawing on Monday, Sept. 8 will reset to \$20 million.

Powerball Grand Prizes currently start at \$20 million and roll until the jackpot is won. Players win the Grand Prize by matching five numbers from a field of 69 numbers and one Powerball number from a field of 26 numbers. By choosing Power Play® for \$1 more per Play, players can multiply their non-Grand Prize winnings by two, three, four, five or 10 times*. A Power Play Match Five (5+0) prize is set at \$2 million regardless of the Power Play number selected. All other non-Grand Prizes will be multiplied by the Power Play number selected. (*The 10X Power Play multiplier is available for drawings in which the initially advertised annuitized Grand Prize amount is \$150 million or less.).

Drawings are broadcast each Monday, Wednesday and Saturday at 10:12 p.m. CT. Texas Lottery players can purchase Powerball tickets at more than 19,000 Texas Lottery retailers across the state. Ticket sales close at 9 p.m. CT on draw nights. The retailer that sells a jackpot-winning Powerball ticket is eligible to receive a bonus of up to \$250,000.
